Director of Pastoral Care Job Search

North Hills Community Baptist Church is presently searching for a candidate to fill the position of Director of Pastoral Care. It is a part-time position, expected to require 10 hours per week. Clearances are required. The salary for 2018 was \$10,861 a year, plus mileage reimbursement.

The Director of Pastoral Care reports to and works directly for the Pastor. Job responsibilities are designed to aid the Pastor in carrying out his responsibilities in the area of pastoral care. Duties will include, but are not limited to:

- Attend weekly staff meetings with the Pastor and church secretary
- Share, along with the Pastor, in visitation of hospitalized and travel-restricted members
- Share in visitation of the general church population
- Be available to members and others in times of crises and at other times when pastoral care is needed, particularly in the absence of the Pastor
- Be intentional about pastoral care to new members and visitors.


