"God Guides & Protects Us"


Plan to stay following worship for The All Church Picnic

Summer Sunday School "Short Stories by Jesus" June 16 - July 21

Explore a fresh and timely interpretation of Jesus' most popular teaching parables.

Jesus was a skilled storyteller and perceptive teacher who used parables from everyday life to effectively convey his message and meaning. Life in first-century Palestine was very different from our world today, and many traditional interpretations of Jesus' stories ignore this disparity and have often allowed anti-Semitism and misogyny to color their perspectives.

In this Bible study based on her *Short Stories by Jesus*, Amy-Jill Levine analyzes these "problems with parables" taking readers back in time to understand how their original Jewish audience understood them. With this revitalized understanding, she interprets these moving stories for the contemporary reader, showing how the parables are not just about Jesus, but are also about us—and when read rightly, still challenge and provoke us two thousand years later.



GIVE THE GIFT OF READING

Each year that we have a delegation traveling to Nicaragua, we send donations. In the past, we have sent baby layettes, bats and balls, medicine, and office supplies. These items are packed in our delegates' suitcases. This year, we will be donating Spanish translated books to supply the new Cyber Car Library at the AMOS campus. We have a three-page list of books that can be ordered. We have 12 travelers who can take at least three books each... so, we'd like to raise the funds to order AT LEAST 36 books. Pleasant Valley Shelter

We meet on the fourth Tuesday of each month to prepare a meal to serve to the men who stay at the Northside Common Ministries shelter on Brighton Road. You can help in any of three ways:

- 1. Donate food for the meal. A sign-up sheet is located on the table at the back of the sanctuary. Sign up to bring an item and make sure it is in the NHCBC kitchen (labeled PVS) on or before 5:30 pm on the fourth Tuesday of the month.
- 2. Help prepare the meal. We cook the meal in the NHCBC kitchen. Start time is either 5:30 or 6:00 pm, depending on the menu that night. The sign-up sheet will have the start time on it. We are done cooking by 8 pm.
- 3. Help serve the meal. We leave from NHCBC between 8 and 8:15 pm, with all our food items loaded into vehicles, headed for PVS. If you wish to help serve, you can park at NHCBC and ride out with others or you can meet us at PVS about 8:15 or 8:30 pm. We are usually done serving the meal by 9:30 pm. You can head home from there or go back to NHCBC to get your vehicle.

You can help with 1, 2, or all 3 parts. You do NOT need to help every month. If you are interested in helping you can contact Bill Davis (412.538.9640) or Joyce Katich (412.496.4310).
