On Saturday, April 11, 2020, Church Council held a Special Meeting via conference call and took action to approve the submission of application by NHCBC for a non-collateralized loan as part of the Paycheck Protection Program that was approved recently by Congress. In brief, eligible small businesses and qualified Sec 501(c)3 organizations (of which NHCBC is one) are able to apply for a low interest (1%) non-collateralized loan to assist them in dealing with the financial uncertainty caused by the COVID 19 pandemic. Providing the proceeds of the loan are used in accordance with prescribed guidelines, the loan can turn into a grant at the end of two years and would be 100% forgiven. Church Council approved the action and an application for a loan in the amount of \$32,317 was submitted the next day. As of this writing, we have not yet received word on the approval of the loan.

Since the NHCBC Constitution is silent with respect to the process for approving the application for a loan (other than a mortgage loan, which requires congregational approval), Church Council took this action in the interest of submitting the application in a timely fashion. Once the restrictions on group gatherings are lifted and we are again able to gather as a congregation, the Moderator intends to call a Special Congregational Meeting at which the congregation will be asked to ratify the action of Church Council. If you do not contact us or complete the form, we will assume you give your permission for your photos to be used. You may also contact us to have your photos removed after the website is published.



Mark 12: 41-44

In early February, after returning from Missouri where I had been helping care for my daughter and her husband who had been in a bad car accident, I became ill and was checked for the



The first appointment went well except for rain. The second appointment, all went as it should. The third appointment, I went to pay the co-pay, but where was my checkbook? It was not in my purse. Fortunately, I had enough cash to pay the co-pay. I had previously used a check to pay the first doctor co-pay but did not need it for the second one.

I tried to remember everything I had done since last using it...where had we gone? What had happened? All I could remember was getting gas, going to an ATM and to the supermarket where I had spilled some of the contents of my purse after getting through the check out line. In picking it up, I could not remember picking up a checkbook which should have been among the spillage. Where was my checkbook?

I kept looking everywhere it might be in the house. I even dumped the garbage can and the recycle bin and looked at everything, piece by piece. Still no checkbook, so I had no choice but to call the bank and tell them my story. The bank was concerned about identity theft as was I. I got a stop payment order on the remaining checks.

I prayed, prayed, and prayed some more and continued praying for days.

Thirteen days later, I received a call from the Get-Go on Route 8, that someone had turned in my checkbook and I could have it by bringing proof of my identity and naming two items that were found with my checkbook.

The next morning, I headed there quite early. Yes, they had the checkbook. The clerk apparently had not gotten the message that I had to identify any other items, which was good, as I had been trying to think what else was missing. It turned out there were three other items.

When I asked who had turned it in, I was told there was no name anywhere, and they did not know if it was a man, woman or child. Everything looked like it had been very well cared for.

Yes, I had prayed about it both day and night while it was missing. So, YES, I can say God does answer prayers. THANK YOU, GOD! And, thank you also that some people are very honest..

No, I am not the poor widow mentioned in the Bible quote, but I may have been if someone had not been honest.
