Drive-In Worship

Dear Church Family,

First and foremost, I would like to thank all of you, on behalf of the Board of Deacons for your patience and understanding during these difficult times. As promised the Board of Deacons has been meeting bi-weekly and monitoring the guidelines recommended by the CDC and our state and county health departments. Currently those guidelines state that there are to be no indoor gatherings that exceed 25 people. Therefore, we have decided not to return to in-person worship in September. We are, however, planning drive-in worship services that will begin on Rally Day, September 13. The service will be at 11:30, following the live stream at 10:00.

For the drive in service please park, facing the church, in the upper and middle parking lots, or use the lower one, if necessary. Pastor Tim will broadcast his message from the grassy area outside of his office and you will tune into a designated radio station that will be announced in upcoming communications. There will also be signs indicating the radio station. This service will consist of just prayer, scripture and the sermon. We will have the full worship service from the empty sanctuary in the 10:00 live stream.

We do ask that you remain in your cars in order to maintain social distancing. We are hoping that by having this drive in service we will see each other's smiling faces and be encouraged that we are moving forward and working together, in Christ, through this trying time.

NHCBC Youth Ministries Launches Cotalyst Small Group Ministry Program

Welcome Fall and the beginning of a new direction for our NHCBC Youth Ministries Program! This year our youth will embark on a journey that our ministry team hopes will inspire students to look at worldly issues from a more focused lens of Christian love and a desire to be the catalysts of change in their schools, communities, and the world.

So, what is a Small Group Ministry Program? Small Group Ministry creates a more relational environment where we hope all students will feel a close sense of fellowship with volunteers from our congregation acting as Christian mentors. This year our students will be organized into groups based on age and gender, each having their own adult mentor.

What will our youth service look like? After an opening time of games and fun fellowship (social distancing guidelines will be followed!) our entire group will come together for a group lesson and then students will break off into their separate groups for more individualized conversations. We would like to welcome Sarah Hefferin as our Junior High female small group leader and Alex Kurtz as our Junior High male small group leader to our youth ministry team! Pastor Tim and myself will lead the High School group this year, however if the new direction we are taking peaks your interest and you would like to be a part of making a real difference in the lives of our youth please reach out to me and we can see where your talents can fit into our ministry!

Our youth program will be known as *Cotalyst*, where we will work together to empower students to lead like Jesus through our study of the Bible. This year we will focus specifically on the books of Acts and James. The hope is to then apply our Christian values to conditions we see around us and promote positive change in our community. Our students are in a unique position to be able to affect attitudes amongst their peers and be a generation of healing and not division. Prayers for a safe and successful year of youth ministry are appreciated and we hope you will take the opportunity to see the updates to our youth rooms and to check in with our youth from time to time and see what's up!

We will then review those answers, and prayerfully consider where God may lead our Mission focus and efforts in the coming year.

If you begin thinking now about areas of mission that you'd like our church to focus on, the survey will only take about five minutes to complete. 
