Dear Friends,

Many of you have asked questions about my future relationship with the church after I retire on January 31, 2022. Ministerial relations after retirement or resignation are an important topic, and especially so when congregation and pastor have been together for thirty-two years. The transition from what was to what is to come requires sensitivity and understanding on the part of pastor and people.



When I was ordained to the Christian ministry on October 28, 1984, I affirmed my intention to abide by the Code of Ethics for Ministerial Leaders of American Baptist Churches. You will find this document online if you google it. Among the fourteen bullet points contained within the code of ethics, this one particularly addresses our situation: "I will, upon my resignation or retirement, sever my ministerial leadership relations with my former constituents, and will not make ministerial contacts in the field of another ministerial leader without his/her request and/or consent."

Why is this important and what does it mean? It is important because as your pastor I have literally seen an entire generation, from young toddlers to middle-aged adults, grow up during my time here. I have baptized you, married you, visited you in the hospitals, and grieved with you when loved ones died. All of this creates very special bonds between pastor and people. The bonds of friendship and Christian love will never be broken.

So what does this mean? It means that even now God is lifting up the next pastor who will come to lead the North Hills Community Baptist Church. She or he will come as a stranger, unknown to you but eager to be your pastor and spiritual leader. The next pastor will baptize you, perform your weddings, and officiate at the funeral of your loved ones. This person will laugh and cry with you, break bread and drink coffee with you, visit in your home and when you are in the hospital. As they do so, he or she will develop that special relationship; the kind of pastoral partnership that we have shared for these last three plus decades. Practically, this means that I will not be performing the aforementioned pastoral duties once I am no longer pastor of the church.

As you may know, Pauline and I intend to remain here in Pittsburgh for the short term. We will attend church elsewhere for the foreseeable future, giving time and space for the interim and the new pastor to be your pastor. Surely we will see you around at times, perhaps on the street or in a restaurant, and I look forward to saying hello and catching up. In the meantime it is important that I provide time and space for the new pastor of North Hills Community Baptist Church to begin her or his relationship with you. "Thank you" does not begin to express our feelings for the thirty-two years we've shared together. NHCBC is a special place.


Nature. We are all born to help each other. No matter how difficult it is....life is good when you are happy; but much better when other are happy because of you!"
