During April we realize that the last two weeks of Lent are upon us as we get prepared for holy week. That includes Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and finally Easter Sunday. These are big days in the life of Jesus and his disciples and important days for those of us who walk with Jesus to the cross and beyond.

I invite you to read the story again to prepare your heart to recall the cost of our salvation, so that when the day of celebration comes, you will better understand the cost of the grace that is ours as modern disciples of Jesus.



On Palm Sunday (John 12:12–50), Jesus enters Jerusalem for the celebration of Passover. (That is when the Jewish people celebrated their deliverance from slavery in Egypt under the leadership of Moses). Jesus was thought to be the long-awaited Messiah who would conquer those who were against the Jews. Unfortunately for them, Jesus' understanding of his mission was quite different from those who celebrated his arrival that day.

On Maundy Thursday (Maundy) is the English translation of the Latin word "Mandatum" for "command" which refers to Jesus words in John 13:34 "A new command I give you; love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another."

That is also the night Jesus washed the disciples feet (take time to read John 13:1–17); also Jesus predicts being betrayed and Judas leaves the meal (take time to read John 13:18-30). Finally, Jesus predicts Peter's denial (John 13:31–38).

Good Friday – this is when Jesus was sentenced to death (John 19:1-16), the cross of Jesus (John 19:17–42)

Easter Sunday – the resurrection of Jesus!! (John 20:1–29).

Friends in Christ – this is not only His story, it is ours as well. Take the time to read it, absorb it, and let it transform who you are "in Christ."

#### Youth Update

During this season of Lent, the Catalyst youth have been discussing how and why it is important to make wise choices and how we can use our faith to guide these choices. We have touched on the topics of trust, resisting temptation, habits, fear, and repentance. Due to our small group of high school students in the Sr. High Sunday school class, we have moved the 8th graders up and are embarking on a discussion of Holy Week led by Ryan Buschmeyer. After Lent, and for the remainder of the year, the class will participate in a video series based on the book 'The Case for Christ' written by Rev. Lee Strobel. The Jr. High class will continue with its original curriculum, drawing life application conclusions from familiar and not so familiar Biblical individuals and their circumstances.

In an attempt to create deeper engagement with our Catalyst students, we have created 4 committees that will assist in planning our many activities. The students chose their committee based on their interests. We now have a Missions committee which helped direct us in our choice of our summer mission trip and they will also direct us in other community outreach projects to help neighbors in need. The Worship committee has formed a student praise band that will make their live debut on Sunday April 3rd during our youth music worship time. The Worship committee will also create skits to perform during our study time to help us bring to life the student views of topics we discuss. The Fellowship committee is responsible for the games we play each week as well as fun outside activities such as movie nights, foodie outings, campfires, retreats etc. Finally, our Fundraising committee will come up with new ideas for raising the monies needed for us to do our mission trips and outreach, retreats, and outside activities. Be on the lookout for the return of our Mother's Day plant sale & car wash, a kickball tournament, carnival and many other fun ideas to engage the community in our efforts to serve others. It is my hope that involving students' voices in practical ministry outreach opportunities will instill in them a sense of accomplishment and prepare them to serve as they develop into young adults, excited to be involved with their church family.

towns across the state. We have a firm date and place!! Our trip will be **August 7-13** and working in Kentucky. We will begin accepting volunteers to serve soon. The cost will be approximately \$500 (final cost not set yet) but will cover transportation, most meals and lodging.

#### Serving Those in Need

A partnership between North Hills Community Baptist Church (NHCBC) and Providence Point (a Baptist Senior Family Community) has resulted in a helpful, caring outreach ministry.

With an idea originating at NHCBC, and a member moving to Providence Point, God has used the resources of many and talents of a few to help some Pittsburgh homeless who live outdoors most of the year. Using a



resource we all take for granted, plastic shopping bags, and the "down time" during the COVID pandemic, groups from these two organizations made several PLARN Bed Rolls.

Under the coordination of Sherry Willison-Armstrong at Providence Point, residents gathered plastic bags, then cut strips and rolled plastic yarn (PLARN) into rolls. Once done, the PLARN was taken to North Hills and crocheted into bed mats and a carrying strap was attached to each.

PLARN bed rolls are used to provide a waterproof pad between a person and the ground. It can also be doubled to provide a comfortable mat for sitting. The waterproof factor is key in helping individuals who live outdoors stay dry, warmer and healthy.

This past December, NHCBC took the first round of mats to the Emergency Shelter at Smithfield United Church of Christ. In all, 11 mats were delivered before Christmas. To date, there are at least four additional mats completed, with another 7-8 expected to be completed for another delivery this spring.

We thank God for those who have understood the message from Matthew 25: 34-40 and took part in this project. Additionally, we pray those who use these bed rolls will be blessed by them.

THANK YOU to those "meeting a need and ministering to the soul." Looking forward to another collaborative project!

#### Some Random Thoughts on Prayer

Jim used to have a shirt that read 'So many books, so little time.' I started thinking about that in terms of prayer. There are so many needs in our world today that we might often feel overwhelmed. There's just not enough time in the day to lift up the needs that we're aware of; and then we have those unknown and unspoken needs that need to be lifted up. It's sometimes a dilemma because we know the power of prayer and we don't want to risk leaving someone or something off of our prayer list. The good news is that God knows our hearts and He knows all of the needs of His people. So, we try our best and God's got the rest.



In fact, I remember a co-worker years ago feeling distressed because she didn't know the details of another co-worker's illness. She didn't know what to pray for. The beauty of prayer is that she didn't need to know any details; she just needed to lift that co-worker up to God.

Besides lifting up the needs of our brothers and sisters, God just desires to be in communion with us. Prayer is the way we do that. God wants to know our feelings, our struggles, our dreams.
